Saint of the Month

Bl. Elizabeth Canori Mora February 6th

Elisabetta was born to noble and rich in 1774 Rome Italy. She grew up in loving home and was cared for by her parents. In 1796 the lawyer Cristofora Mora however it soon proved the Christofora was abusive husband and feckless husband. Together they had two daughters that survived to adulthood, but soon after in 1801 Cristofora abandoned Elisabetta and his children leaving them poor and destitute. However despite all of this Elisabetta never gave to despair and continued despite her poverty to live pious life and care for the poor. Her friends and even confessor encouraged Elisabetta to separate from her husband, but she refused believing since the sacrament of marriage is divine she has a duty to pray for her husband even is he doesn't deserve it. Becoming a third order Trinitarian she was considered a spiritual pillar of Rome due to her good deeds. She died on February 5th 1825 by her daughters. Upon her death, Christofora had a conversion of heart and became a Franciscan and died in 1845.
